Water Heating and Other Winter Energy Saving Tips

- Set the water heater thermostat to 120°F for most uses. Set to "vacation" mode when away for one week or more.
- Use low-flow showerheads and faucets.
- Insulate exposed hot water pipes.
- Set your heating and air conditioning thermostat between 65-68°F during the winter months, health permitting, and save about 1% on your heating bill for each degree you lower your thermostat.
- Inspect your home for cool drafts, which may come from cracks or gaps in walls, ceilings, and around window and doors. Weatherstrip, spray foam or caulk as needed.
- Wash full loads in your dishwasher and washing machines to save energy and money.

Tax Credit

If you earned less than \$43,352 (individual), or \$48,362 (married) last year, the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) will work for you. EITC is a refundable federal income tax credit for low-income working individuals and families, and could pay you as much as \$5,666, depending upon number of qualifying children.

To qualify, a taxpayer must meet certain eligibility guidelines and file a tax return.

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) and Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) programs offer FREE tax assistance to low to moderate-income taxpayers, and are often located in convenient community locations.
