PROPOSITION 65

The Safe Drinking Water and Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986, commonly referred to as Proposition 65, requires the Governor to publish a list of chemicals “known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects, or other reproductive harm.” It also requires California businesses to warn the public, once every three months, of potential environmental exposures to any of the listed chemicals for which the business is responsible.

Southwest Gas delivers natural gas to its customers and uses petroleum products in its operations. Natural gas and its combustion by-products and the petroleum products the company uses in its operations contain chemicals “known to the State of California to cause cancer, birth defects, or other reproductive harm.”
