**Subject: 2022 Post-Test Year Margin Adjustment to include the North Lake Tahoe Lateral Replacement Project, Authorized in Decision 21-03-052.**

Southwest Gas Corporation (Southwest Gas or Company) hereby submits for approval by the California Public Utilities Commission (Commission) revisions to its California Gas Tariff. The tariff sheets being modified as a result of this submission are listed on Attachment A.

**Purpose**

The purpose of this submission is to include an adjustment to Southwest Gas' 2022 Post Test-Year Margin (PTYM) to recover costs associated with the Company's North Lake Tahoe Lateral Replacement Project (NLTL Project) authorized in Decision (D.) 21-03-052, which approved Southwest Gas' Test Year 2021 General Rate Case (Application (A.) 19-08-015). This adjustment is for rates applicable to Southwest Gas' Northern California rate jurisdiction only.

**Background**

On August 30, 2019, Southwest Gas filed A.19-08-015, requesting authority to increase rates and charges for natural gas service in California, effective January 1, 2021. On August 3, 2020, Southwest Gas, the Public Advocates Office of the Commission and the City of Victorville filed a Joint Motion for Adoption of Settlement Agreement resolving all outstanding issues. On March 24, 2021, the Commission issued D.21-03-052, approving the Joint Motion.

Per the Settlement Agreement, once each phase of the NLTL Project is placed into service and operational, Southwest Gas will calculate the associated revenue requirement for each phase and include that revenue requirement in rates as a PTYM adjustment through the Advice Letter process.

### **Southwest Gas Adjustment to Its 2022 PTYM for the NLTL Project**

In accordance with D.21-03-052, Southwest Gas' Advice Letter No. 1191 sets forth its 2022 PTYM adjustments for its three rate jurisdictions, including Northern California. Through this Advice Letter, Southwest Gas seeks to increase its 2022 PTYM adjustment of \$526,921 applicable to its Northern California rate jurisdiction to include \$124,768 for the revenue requirement associated with NLTL Project. This results in an overall 2022 PTYM adjustment of \$651,689 for Northern California. Southwest Gas proposes to include the NLTL Project revenue requirement in rates effective February 1, 2022. The calculation of the 2022 PTYM revenue requirement is included in the schedule provided in Attachment B.

### **Residential Gas Rate and Bill Impact**

On May 8, 2020, the Energy Division issued a standing data request to all energy utilities requiring detailed rate and bill impacts (utilizing the provided template) for any Advice Letter that requests the implementation of a rate change (i.e., margin adjustment, annual balancing account update, etc.). The bill impact is provided in Attachment C.

### **Effective Date**

Southwest Gas believes this Advice Letter is subject to Energy Division disposition and should be classified as Tier 2 (Effective after Energy Division Disposition) pursuant to General Order (GO) 96-B. Southwest Gas respectfully requests the revised tariff sheets be approved January 21, 2021, which is thirty (30) days from the date submitted, with an effective date of February 1, 2022.
